Why do we need it?



- Many workshop technicians struggle to fit struts
- They could sometimes refuse work if it seems complicated
- Often the wrong tools are used
- KYB needs to help it's workshop customers





Why do it this way?



- At least 50% of all mobiles are smart-phones
- Most technicians have smart-phones
- QR codes are popular and well used
- The code is on the product box so instant access
- Even if the content changes, the QR code remains the same



QR Code



How do you read the code?



- Free QR reader can be downloaded on any smart phone
- Scan the phone over the QR code
- The QR code can be scanned vertically or horizontally
- The QR code takes the phone to the mobile website
- This gives access to the data





Which parts?



- The QR code will first appear on KYB struts
- Other products and ranges will follow
- Information will be updated ongoing





How does it work?




QR Code on strut box

The QR code appears on the carton box next to the KYB part number. The technician scans the QR code.




They will then be given a choice of information: Fitting Video (if available for that application), Fitting Instructions, Useful Information, Visual Parts Inspection



You see the relevant information for that part.
































Romania
